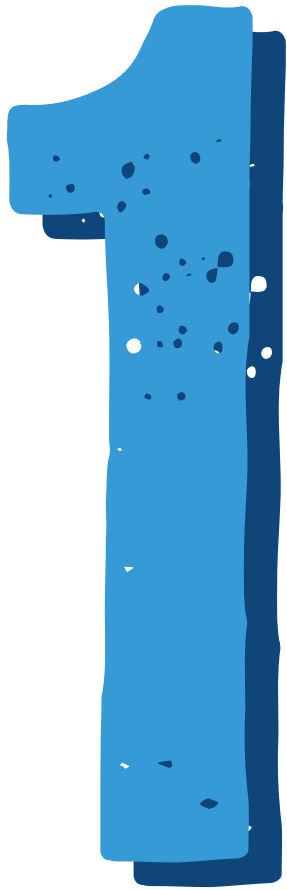

It's essential to properly dispose of hazardous waste in your business for environmental sustainability and to meet legal requirements.

You can ensure safety and compliance in handling hazardous business waste with five simple steps



Correctly **CLASSIFY** your hazardous waste

In a business setting, everyday items like cleaning chemicals, batteries, aerosols, and toner cartridges are classed as hazardous waste, legally requiring disposal in line with strict regulations.

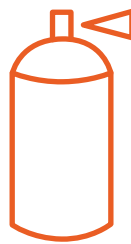

SEPARATE hazardous waste



Once identified, you must segregate these materials from non-hazardous waste to prevent contamination and ensure safe disposal.

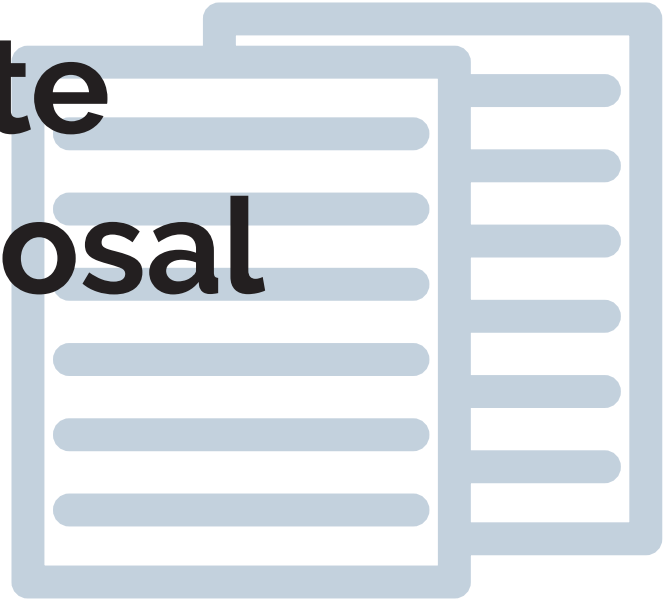
HOW DO I DO THIS?

- Store and transport all hazardous waste in UN certified/approved containers
- Clearly label containers with the type of waste, it's potential hazards and the date it was first stored
- Store containers in areas that are secure, well-ventilated, and away from high traffic areas and extreme weather conditions
- Store all hazardous waste in bunded COSHH cabinets or on bunded pallets to prevent them from being in direct contact with the floor to minimise potential leaks

waste disposal



As the waste producer, you are legally required to use a Hazardous Waste Consignment Note, completing sections A and B.

In Section A of the hazardous waste consignment note, you must provide details about the origin and destination of the waste, including the consignment note code, the producer's and consignee's names, addresses, and contact details.

In Section B, a description of the waste is required, covering the European Waste Catalogue (EWC) code, quantity, physical form, chemical composition, hazard codes, and any specific handling or packaging requirements.

It's important to maintain records for three years at the location that produced or stored waste.

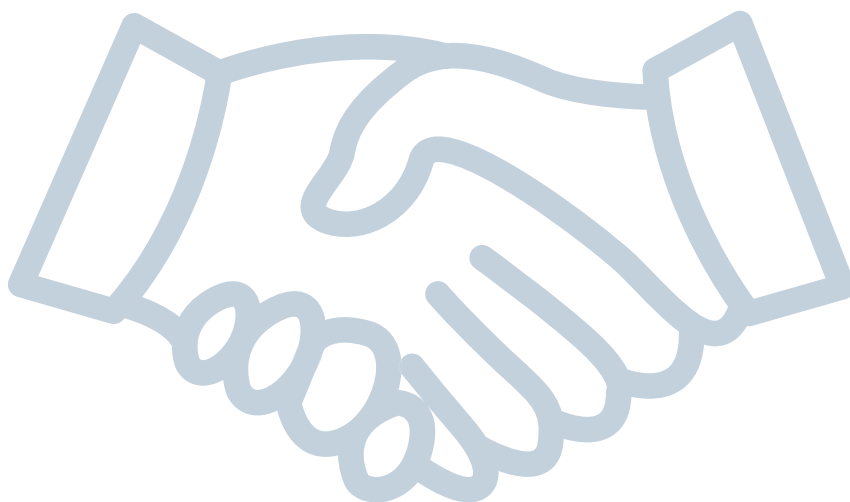

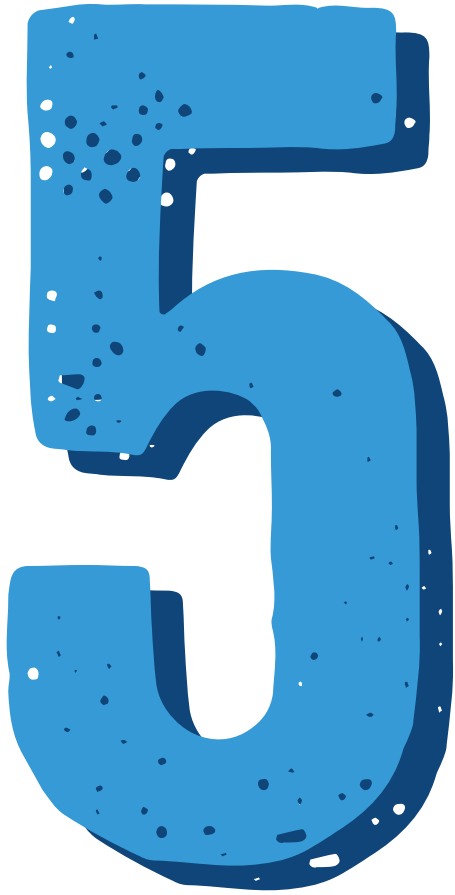
