31st March **2025** 

All businesses, with 10 or more full-time employees, must start separating all dry recyclables (glass, paper, card, metals, plastics) and ensure food waste is collected separately, regardless of the amount produced

31<sup>st</sup> March **2027** 

Micro-firms (with fewer than 10 full-time employees) must comply with the new legislation, and all businesses must recycle plastic film packaging
